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ACCOMPLISHMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR MEDICAL STUDENTS IN PHARMACOLOGY AND PHARMACOTHERAPY II.

Considering the Academic and Examination Regulations of the University of Szeged and the Faculty Academic Regulations the conditions for semester accomplishment at the Department of Pharmacology and Pharmacotherapy are as follows:

1/ Participation in courses taken up in the electronic study system (Neptun) is compulsory. The attendance of the practical will be continuously controlled by the Department. **In case of absence over 25 % the department will refuse the acceptance of the practical course, the student cannot be admitted to the final examination.** Certification about the absence should be presented to the teacher of the practical within 1 week upon arrival. The Educational Representative of the Department (not the teacher of the practical) may permit supplementation of the missing practical (max. 2 times during the semester) in the given week with another practice group.

2/ In this semester, there will be three MTOs during the practices on dates specified in the curriculum. Participation in each MTO is compulsory. In case of absence, MTO can be substituted only if the student officially justifies the absence (e.g. by a final report from the hospital). The grade of missing MTOs will be failed (1). **One occasion is permitted for each MTO (no repetition).**

3/ The semester ends with a final examination in written and oral form, covering all topics discussed during the two semesters in Pharmacology and Pharmacotherapy. The written part takes place on the working day preceding the oral exam in the form of multiple choice test questions. In the oral exam, 5 oral final topics will be discussed.

4/ **The pre-requirement for the oral exam is a successfully completed (at least 60 %) written exam.** In case of the second and third repeated retake examinations (third or fourth examination chances) and the last (sixth) examination chances, regardless of the result of the written part, the student will be allowed to take the oral part of the exam.

Exemption from the written part can be achieved if the results of all three MTOs are at least good (4). The exemption from the written part is valid only for the first examination attempt, a repeated exam will be in both written and oral form.
